The Soldier Ride Carolinas Challenge started at the Mary Black Healthcare Campus in Spartanburg. Plenty of injured soldiers also took part in the either 25 or 62 mile event. The Wounded Warrior Organization started by veterans to honor their wounded brothers. News Channel 7 talked with one soldier who lost his leg when his vehicle hit a roadside bomb in Iraq in 2006.

Brent Hendrix with the U.S. Army said, "It's good to see all these people that are going to take the time out of their day to ride bikes with us. I hope they can keep up".
